Objectives:

- Each year the Foundation may award a grant to a division school up to a maximum of \$5,000.00.
- All projects and programs must be compatible with the objectives of the Foundation.
- The objective of the School Project Enhancement Grant is to enhance school programs/projects/initiatives that are not funded by Alberta Education.

Priority will be given to:

- Projects that demonstrate innovative practices, initiative and sustainability.
- Projects that incorporate community partnerships (other schools, parent organizations, local parishes and community groups).
- Projects that can demonstrate direct impact on students.
- Projects which assist students, teachers and staff achieve a new level of excellence.

Scholarships can be established to support students as they venture out into post-secondary education. Criteria can be specified to target particular areas of interest or in memory of a loved one. Tax receipts available for donations.

Available to a Grade 10 to 12 student to promote spiritual growth, Christian lifestyle, and development of religious leadership skills.

Education Foundation Servant Leader Scholarship (\$500.00 annually)

Available to all grades at all schools to students who demonstrate a servant heart and is active in making a positive difference in the world.

James Michael (Mickey) Lynch Memorial Scholarship (\$200.00 annually)
Available to a Grade 12 student who was also a graduate of St. Louis
School. Chosen based on demonstrated skills in English grammar and
must be registered in post-secondary education program.

Joe Stroh Memorial Scholarship (\$500.00 annually)

<u>Available to a Grade 12 student</u> selected for outstanding citizenship and service within the school and church community.

Mook Giesinger Awards (\$300.00 annually)

Diligence Awards (\$50.00 each) given to <u>students in Grades 1 to 6 at St. Louis School</u> who work hard, show improvement, and exhibit an excellent attitude and effort.

Pat Cullen Memorial Scholarship (\$900.00 annually)

Math Awards <u>available to St. Mary's students</u>. \$200.00 each to Grades 7 to 9 highest achievement; \$100.00 each to Grades 7 to 9 second highest achievement.

Sister Joan Burns Memorial Scholarship (\$900.00 annually)

Religious Studies Awards <u>available to St. Mary's students</u>. \$200.00 each Grades 7 to 9 highest achievement; \$100.00 each to Grades 7 to 9 second highest achievement.

Stan Gill Memorial Scholarship (\$500.00 annually)

<u>Available to a Grade 12 student</u> with highest mark in Biology 20 & 30 combined.

Tom Anderson Memorial Scholarship (\$500.00 annually)

Available to a Grade 12 student who is planning to pursue a career in Business and is registered in business related post-secondary program.

Winter Games Legacy Scholarship (\$500.00 annually)

<u>Available to a Grade 12 students</u>. Candidates must have displayed leadership in their chosen sport and be enrolled in a post-secondary program.

GRANTS AWARDED

St. Louis School - **Christmas Hamper Program** (\$1,000.00) - Funds were used to purchase 2 Christmas hampers for families at St. Louis School.

Notre Dame Academy - Partition Curtain for Gymnasium (\$160.00).

Religious Education Congress (\$1,500.00) - Grant was used to cover cost of registration and resources for 3 teachers to attend a variety of sessions concerning ministry, teaching and faith development.



St. Mary's School - Seussical, Jr. (\$1,000.00) - Grant was used to support the musical production by covering cost of printing and transportation to and from event location.

École St. Thomas d'Aquin - Grade 6 Retreat (\$500.00) - Funds used to transport students to Camp McCoy to participate in activities to develop their leadership skills and learn more about their faith.

St. Patrick's School - Caring Kids Campaign (\$400.00) - Funds used to create Caring Kids Kits to share with individuals at the Salvation Army Soup Kitchen.

WE Day - Monsignor McCoy High School, Notre Dame Academy and St. Mary's School (\$2,640.00) -







